Annual Report – Gretchen mentioned just a few highlights from the annual report which can be found in its' entirety on the LSV website

- Water Shut-Off Valve Locations Rick worked with KAWC to locate and label all the locations of the units' water shut off valves. It is important to know the location of your units water shut off valve.
- Lexington Fire Department Smoke Alarm Program Many residents took advantage of the offer from the fire department to come out and install free 10 year smoke alarms. Program is still being offered and can be taken advantage of.
- **New Exterior Lights** The installation of the new exterior lights throughout the village has been completed.
- **Stone Wall Installation Project** The 86-95 courtyard area had the railroad ties replaced with block walls.
- **Repair & Resealing Parking Lots** All the parking lots were repaired and resealed this year.
- **Gator** A gator was purchased for Rick's use to make his work more efficient. He loves the gator.
- **Feasibility Study** The feasibility study was completed this year. We now have a comprehensive plan and can begin to find permanent solutions for the drainage and erosion issues in the village.
- **Boat Storage** The boat storage area has been revamped to improve accessibility and storage in boat area.
- **Cemetery** Funds were acquired from the city to help with the cemetery clean-up project. Ann, Rick and B&R Tree Care worked together to improve the looks of the cemetery area.
